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Collegium musicum - course outline Mr. Ed Harkless - teacher

This is an advanced, audition/selected vocal ensemble that specializes in unaccompanied music of the late Middle Ages and Renaissance. Music from other eras is also used. However, the ensemble currently utilizes Gothic costuming and also has tuxes and black gowns for a wider range of repertoire.

Emphasis is placed upon quality singing and tone production, multiple languages in vocal repertoire, responsibility to an organizational effort, independence of thought, critical thinking and analysis of one's' own and the ensembles' performance, and attention to detail and high expectation in performance and comprehension of the subject matter. Music reading skills are also addressed with extensive work on solfege and rhythm reading. All students must be music readers!

Collegium musicum annually presents the Christmas Madrigal Dinner and in the spring, the Collegium musicum Experience. These events have tremendous support from business and community.

All performances are required, graded events as are all rehearsals, whether they are during class, before school, break, lunch time or outside the school day. Make-up work is required for ANY absence for ANY reason. There are no exceptions.

In addition, Collegium musicum takes an annual spring tour that provides opportunities for onsite educational experiences and performances. For example, in medieval costume, the group presented a concert in a Toronto castle (Casa Loma); presented a prelude program of sacred Renaissance music at the Washington National Cathedral, several venues in Ireland, and has performed in other historical sites where they have had the opportunity to experience a slice of life and history approach to learning. In 2007, they participated in the Heritage Music Festival in San Francisco and won the Silver Award and in 2008 participated in the Heritage Music Festival in Atlanta and won the Gold Award. 2011 brought the long awaited return trip to Ireland! They were selected to perform in both Christchurch Cathedral, Dublin, and Bunratty Castle, Shannon. In 2012, they traveled to San Diego and again won Gold plus a director's achievement award (given to groups whose scores are 95% or higher) 2013 performances included Casa Loma, Toronto, and a joint performance of "Carmina Burana" with the WV Wesleyan College Choir. 2014 included the Annual Madrigal Dinner, the Barboursville Fall Festival, WVU Holiday Concert, taping for the first lady of WV holiday show, and performances in Ireland at Bunratty Castle and Christchurch Cathedral. 2014-2015 brought trips to SC and Atlanta, the Renaissance Festival and Kings Island Music Festival. In spring of 2016 they performed in the New York city

This is augmented by up to 30+ programs each year (most on the student's own time) that are presented to/for community, church and civic organizations plus nursing homes, and other schools. Collegium musicum is often requested to be the example of Renaissance music and dress to social studies and literature classes county-wide.

1999 and 2014 brought requests to perform at the Governors School of the Arts. We receive numerous invitations each to perform both locally and abroad. In 2011 and 2014 Collegium musicum was selected as the Honor Choir for the WV Arts Alive Festival at the Clay Center in Charleston.

Goals:

(These are in part of and in addition/conjunction with WV Department of Education CSO's and the National Standards for Music that are covered)

- I. Students will practice, master, and demonstrate proper breathing techniques for singing.
- II. Students will practice, master, and demonstrate proper singing posture.
- III. Students will be aware of major differences in early musical style, (Middle Ages, Renaissance) as compared to later time periods. (Classic, Romantic, 20th Century)

Students will perform complex literature of these major musical eras. Students will explore the inter-disciplinary nature of music.

- VI. Students will demonstrate their progress of the above goals; **individually and collectively**, through singing, written quizzes/exercises, public performances and the use electronic portfolios and educational websites as directed. (for example, posting a singing assignment on Schoology)
- VII. Students will present research on outside reading and seniors present a project. (Effective 1997-98 school year, senior honors students only due to site-based decision to remove original approval of course as honors to underclassmen. These are due in the 2nd and 3rd 9 weeks grading periods. Failure to have projects completed in the assigned 9 weeks will result in the loss of "Honors" credit for the year.
- VIII. All students will behave in a responsible, mature manner in class and at performances. Failure to do so may result in the student being removed from the course.
- IX. Students will demonstrate music reading skills commensurate with a choir of the highest musical level. A variety of assessment tools will be used, including written, oral, and performance based (individually, in small groups and in sections).
- X. Students will demonstrate a high level of understanding and application of solfege. A variety of assessment tools will be used, including written, oral, and performance based (individually, in small groups and in sections) as well as electronic portfolios via recordings and use of educational websites for listening and submitting assignments.

CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS

Being a member of choir is being a member of a team. We must work together for our team to be successful and accomplish our goals. Teamwork takes cooperation, courtesy and commitment. Everyone is important to the team and everyone has responsibilities to the team.

These responsibilities can affect your grade and include (but are not limited to):

- Show respect for the director, other members of the ensemble, and yourself.
- Show respect for the choir room, the equipment, and the music.
- Be on time to all rehearsals and performances.
- Be prepared with your Collegium musicum binder and be in your seat when it is time for class to begin. Students are provided with a three-ring binder for this class. This binder is to be brought to class every day. In this binder, students are to keep all course materials distributed by the director and sharpened pencils. The student is to take care of this notebook. In case of damage or loss, the student is responsible for the replacement of the notebook and contents.
- Put forth your best effort every day with a positive attitude.
- Be responsible for all classroom materials including music, written work, handouts, permission slips, choir uniforms, etc.
- Absolutely no gum, food, or drink in the MUSIC DEPARTMENT, PERIOD.
- As a member of the Choral Department, students are expected to uphold all CMHS policies, both on and off campus.
- To maximize rehearsal time we must start on time, therefore, <u>when the bell rings for class to begin, each student will be in their assigned seats with their music.</u> All talking, etc. will cease.
- Cell phones, iPods, etc., <u>will NOT BE TOLERATED</u> in class, in rehearsal, in performance, or <u>during any group meeting/event.</u> When on trips, they are to be turned off at assigned times (i.e., student meetings, performances, rehearsals, etc.). Student use of these items (and similar gadgets) will result in confiscation of the item(s) (as per the CMHS student handbook policy) and/or exclusion from the current event. Repeat violations of this will result in the student being asked to change their schedule and be removed from the course.

•Students (and parents) will NOT post items on social networks (for example, Facebook, Twitter, etc.) or other media sites (YouTube, Vimeo, etc.) that identify individual students in Collegium musicum. Nor will students or parents post any "gripes", "complaints", etc., EVER on internet sites. This includes posting details about trips, location/times of performances, etc. You may post AFTER students have returned from trips – NOT BEFORE!

*** All decisions regarding repertoire and performances are solely Mr. Harkless'. ***

PHILOSOPHY

The CMHS Choirs are devoted to the study of music, vocal techniques and ensemble skills. Students will be exposed to a variety of music literature, including many different styles and cultures. The goals of our choral ensembles, through rehearsal and performance, are to achieve a high degree of learning and performance excellence, develop a love, understanding and appreciation of music and learn the skills and concepts necessary to successfully participate in a vocal ensemble. It is the responsibility of both the director and the ensemble members to be prepared for each rehearsal and to put forth their best effort at all times.

PERFORMANCES

Being on-time, in complete costume, and ready to perform are essential parts of each performance and is an important life-skill that responsible citizens need. We are training students to have these skills for the market-place. Please read this section carefully!

Attendance: Attendance is required at all performances and outside of class rehearsals.

Performance Dates are posted on Ed Line and are announced in the choir room as well as being announced at monthly Choir Boosters Meetings. An ensemble depends on all of its members. All students are expected to fulfill their responsibility to their ensemble. Performances are the culmination of the classroom learning experience! *They are an important assessment and a significant part of your grade*. Cabell County Schools' policy allows for up to 60% of the student's grade to be from outside of class time performances, etc.

Students are expected to be fully dressed in the required choral wardrobe pieces in order to participate in performances and concerts. (This includes clear nails, assigned footwear, jewelry as explained, etc. for EVERY performance!)

STUDENTS NOT IN COMPLETE PERFORMANCE ATTIRE WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PERFORM AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED MAKE-UP WORK, BUT, INSTEAD, WILL RECEIVE A 0% FOR THAT PERFORMANCE! It is each <u>student's</u> responsibility to have COMPLETE and appropriate costumes for each performance and rehearsal.

You must let Mr. Harkless know with as much advance notice as possible if you will not be able to participate in a performance. Family vacations, birthdays, visiting relatives, too much homework, work and "I don't have a ride", etc. are NOT valid excuses for missing performances, please plan ahead. Remember – there is make-up work required for any missed event, regardless of the reason for the absence.

Any and all missed performances and rehearsals WILL require make-up work, regardless of the reason for the absence. Make-up work is due 1 week from the missed performance. In the case of a performance/rehearsal missed in the last week of a grading period, the make-up work must be submitted to Mr. Harkless in time to be graded and added to the student's 9 weeks grade.

Make-up work is:

Due one week after the missed performance/rehearsal. Topics are to be <u>approved in advance</u> by Mr. Harkless! Written work will be typed (or hand written using the same guidelines as typed papers)

- Times new Roman 12 point font
- Margins shall be 1" OR less on all sides of the paper
- Spacing will be 1.15 to 1.5 only do not double space!

Freshmen 3 complete pages plus 1 page bibliography Sophomores: 4 complete pages plus 1 page bibliography Juniors: 5 complete pages plus 1 page bibliography.

Seniors: 6 complete pages plus 1 page bibliography.

Only **one internet** source is allowed, other sources must also be used and cited.

Topics may include: composer biographies (of composers whose music we perform), a particular musical genre (madrigal, chanson, pavan, etc)

All topics must be approved IN ADVANCE!

Performance Behavior Expectations:

- Be on time for all performances (call times will be announced prior to concert dates).
- Wear appropriate attire. <u>Complete costume is required for each performance.</u>
- Demonstrate appropriate behavior as a performer and as an audience member.
- Represent the CMHS Choral Program with pride.

Businesses have always donated to the dinner with food and/or cash or discounts in the cost of items we need. This is one of the first groups to get busy!) RENAISSANCE COSTUMES:

THESE COSTUMES ARE TO BE COMPLETED BEFORE THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL!

For ladies and gentlemen: Jewelry of any type is NOT to be worn. For the Renaissance costumes – the exception will be pre-approved period pieces only. This includes <u>piercings</u>, <u>ear-rings</u>, <u>necklaces</u>, <u>bracelets</u>, etc. If jewelry is used, it will be uniform by all, subject to Mr. Harkless' approval. Hair MUST be out of the face! (Boys and Girls) Fingernails are to be natural/clear ONLY. <u>If a singer has any other nail polish</u>, or fake nails, they must be removed or clear prior to performing. Piercings must be removed for performances.

All costumes, patterns, material and trim must have approval from Mr. Harkless.

They are gothic in design, are primarily velvet, jewel tones, and include head-wear for the ladies and tights for the men. Appropriate shoes must also be worn. If a student is not in complete, approved costume he/she will not perform and will not receive credit for that performance, taking a 0% and will not be given make-up! *Please be completely prepared for all performances!!!!*

PATTERNS AND MATERIAL MUST BE APPROVED IN ADVANCE. You are responsible for the ordering the correct yardage for your costume.

TRIM COLOR/STYLE:

Trim must be approved. Primary color for trim is gold. Brocade or "ribbon-type" trim is acceptable in a color that matches or compliments the overall color and style of the costume. Questions? If there are financial issues for any student, please contact Mr. Harkless directly. A payment plan and/or assistance are both available options. This will be held in complete confidence.

Material is the responsibility of each member!

(Be sure to have it pre- APPROVED before ordering/purchasing material to be sure it is acceptable!!!!!! Mr. Harkless will meet as needed with students and parents to assist in material, pattern and trim selection. Call for help as needed: 304-412-0685 (Mr. Harkless' cell)

TUXES AND FORMAL GOWNS:

The second outfit (tuxes and gowns) is ordered through the Choir Boosters. Students may elect to use some of their credited fundraising money to help purchase these. For the ladies, the dress **MUST** touch the floor. **Black, closed-toe dress shoes for ladies,** and **black sox (NOT ANKLET SOX) and dress shoes for boys.** Dress shoes (boys) are **black.** At no time are open toe, athletic or casual shoes allowed!

- During the course of the year, all students will be given the opportunity to participate in fund raising events. Part of their effort will be applied to a choir trip (if approved) and part will go to purchase extra needed music and supplies, etc. Students are encouraged to participate fully in these group events. The only individual use of fundraising is for costumes or Collegium musicum travel. Any monies raised by the student's fundraising efforts not used for these purposes shall be a part of the CMHS Choir Boosters general revenue. Funds raised DO NOT carry over from one year to the next in students' accounts.
- Students' images may be used for promoting Collegium musicum but at no time will a student be identified individually by name and image combined unless express consent is granted by the parent or legal guardian.
- We may at various times in the year record the group. Any subsequent proceeds from this will be designated as Collegium musicum income and not personal.
- Required events include: outside of class rehearsals and performances, reading assignments, listening to particular music, etc. These will be computed in the grade for the class.
- Absences are simply absences. For any reason will a missed rehearsal or performance will require make -up work. No exceptions will be made! Make up work will be explained and assigned. All make up work is due no later than one week from the missed event. It is expected that the time involved in completing makeup work should reflect the amount of time missed in a particular event and the grade level of the student, i.e. Seniors will be required a higher level of make-up work than underclassmen, etc.
- Collegium musicum at times will be off campus for performances, etc. Parents and other adults will be asked to drive (STUDENTS DO NOT DRIVE DURING THE SCHOOL DAY!) or we will be in a school bus or motor coach.
- Parents/quardians assume complete responsibility for having their child at concerts that are outside the school day.
- An electronic copy of signed documents for Collegium musicum will be accepted as equal
- I understand it is my responsibility as a parent to maintain my own Edline account and to do my best to be active in the Choir Boosters so that I will be up-to-date and involved in my child's role as a member of the Cabell Midland High School Collegium musicum.
